Energy Bills – Are you paying too much?

We have invited Coventry City Council's Affordable Warmth Team to present to residents how they may reduce their energy bills and also make their homes warmer.

The advice topics to be covered include how to check and switch your energy tariffs, how to check if you may be eligible for grants and support to help with paying for your energy bills, energy saving tips for your home and understanding your bills and meters. You will have the opportunity to ask questions.

Election of Committee Members

Members are asked to consider if they would wish to consider joining the committee? Since January, Liliias Maddock has operated as interim secretary and Colin Smith as interim committee member. They both wish to continue in these positions if elected.

St Andrew's Vicar, Greg Smith had previously identified of his intention to stand down as a committee member this Easter but delayed his decision whilst we were in a period of transition. We have now agreed

to Greg's request and thank him for his considerable contribution to establishing the Association. We wish to replace him with a volunteer at our next meeting. Could this be you?

Coventry City Council Local Plan

A public meeting was held at St Andrews Church on Tuesday 19th January at which the local plan was presented. The meeting was attended by more than 300 residents. Key points raised by attendees included;

- Objection to Green Belt development especially in the Eastern Green area
- Questions and concerns were raised regarding infrastructure delivery and the relationship of new homes to existing residential communities.
- Concerns were also raised about the consultation timeframe and the Councils refusal to extend the period beyond 29th January 2016.

Following these meetings the Council received 4 petitions. Of these, some 1095 signatures were submitted objecting to the reclassification of Green Belt Land and the proposed development of the land to provide additional housing, retail and industrial buildings at Eastern Green.

The Council has confirmed that following the 6 weeks consultation period it will conclude its review and will present the plan and responses obtained to The Secretary of State for a period of Public Examination on 31st March 2016.
