



Greenbelt Development Approved

Despite being aware that population projections for Coventry, identified by The Office for National Statistics (ONS) in 2015 are inaccurate the Council has approved the Local Plan which will result in the development of Greenbelt Land around Eastern Green. The Council's proposals are supposedly based on future housing needs but **include plans to build distribution warehouses, retail and commercial properties on what is currently greenbelt.**

Coventry City Council has identified that it has a brownfield land bank that is sufficient for the next 5 years housing needs. We say this should be used whilst true future housing requirements are determined and before there is any loss of Greenbelt.

We have joined with other residents groups to form KOGG (Keep Our Greenbelt Green) and are pursuing actions that we anticipate will succeed in restraining development.

Eastern Green residents have also now formed a community group to represent the concerns of residents. Named Eastern Green Community Group they have been holding regular meetings in Eastern Green Club.
